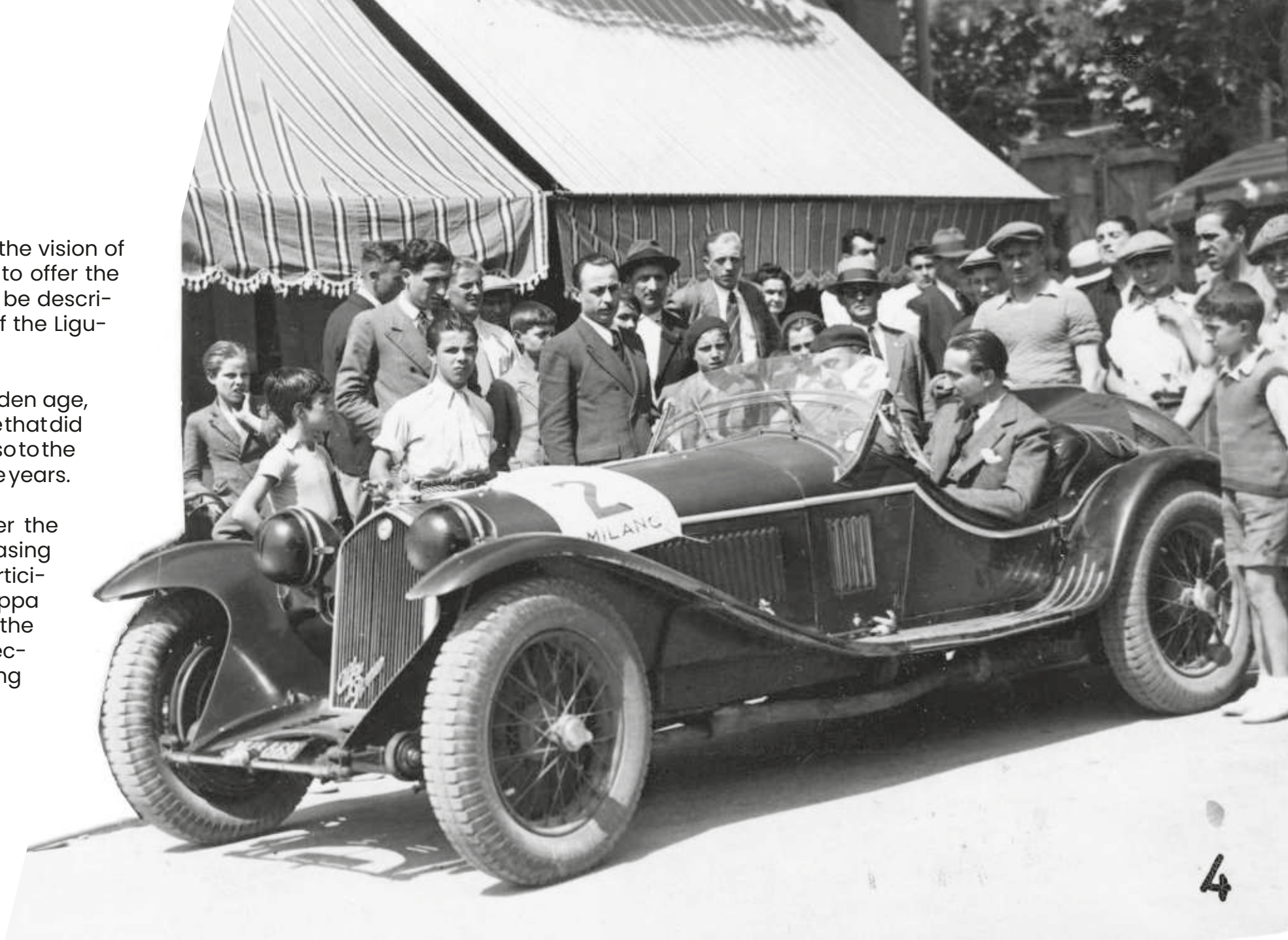


HERITAGE

The Milano-Sanremo was born at the dawn of the last century from the vision of a group of pioneering “gentlemen drivers” of the time, who wanted to offer the first wealthy enthusiasts the chance to take part in what could then be described as a daring promenade toward the sea and the spring colors of the Ligurian Riviera.

It was, however, in the late 1930s that the competition reached its golden age, before being forcibly suspended during the Second World War—a pause that did not prevent it from regaining its former charm as early as 1948, thanks also to the ever-growing crowds of spectators who accompanied the race in those years.

Thanks to its format, which has remained virtually unchanged over the decades, the Milano-Sanremo became a benchmark for an increasing number of international crews. It also stood out for the significant participation of women, which even led to the creation of a dedicated “Coppa delle Dame” (Ladies’ Cup). Definitively discontinued in 1973 following the oil crisis, it was revived in 2003 as a historical revival, attracting collectors from all over the world eager to take on the famous roads leading from the Lombard capital to the City of Flowers.

THE XVII HISTORICAL REVIVAL: HISTORY NEVER ENDS

“After the success of the long-awaited 16th Historical Revival, the Coppa Milano–Sanremo places itself in the world of major classic races, thanks also to its continued participation in the Italian Championship of “Grandi Eventi” organized by ACI Sport and in the FIVA International Calendar, after having won in 2024 the Best in Classic award from Ruoteclassiche as 1st place in the ‘Races’ category.”

The 17th Historical Revival will be a particularly special year, as it will celebrate the 120th anniversary of the Coppa Milano–Sanremo. As is customary, the event will start from the Autodromo Nazionale di Monza, which will host the first day of competition, featuring the now traditional technical and sporting scrutineering, with a greater number of special stages and on-track activities, specifically designed to best celebrate the “Temple of Speed.” Another major novelty will be the return to the traditional linear Milano–Sanremo route. The first day of the event will therefore conclude in Milan, with a special inaugural gala dinner held at an exclusive location in the city center. On Friday, the second day will depart from the Lombard capital toward the Piedmont region, where the crews will stop for the lunch break before continuing toward Rapallo for a brief passage, with arrival and overnight stay in Genoa. The following morning, the crews will set off again from the Ligurian capital. On the third day, the cars will depart from Genoa, passing through the enchanting landscapes of the Bolzaneto hinterland, before the stop in Acqui Terme and a lunch break set in the relaxing surroundings of Loano. From there to

Sanremo, there will be a succession of timed and average-speed regularity tests, leading up to a well-deserved period of relaxation in the “City of Flowers.” The prize-giving ceremony celebrating the 120th anniversary, along with the concluding gala dinner, will be held at the Casino of Sanremo. On Sunday morning, an optional race will take place on the historic Ospedaletti circuit, after which the return journey will be at participants’ discretion. The route itself will thus be made even more historic and distinctive, with the aim of creating a competition format that is even more engaging and exclusive than in previous editions.

Once again this year, the Automobile Club Milano will officially sponsor and provide operational support for the event and, as mentioned, through its sporting body (ACI Sport), will grant it competitive status within the Italian Championship of Major Events. As in the previous year, there will also be the opportunity to take part in the exclusive “Tribute” contest, reserved for modern supercars and the most iconic youngtimers built from 2001 to the present day. The eligibility criteria for the classic race remain unchanged, making use of all groupings provided for by the ACI Sport regulations (from the origins up to the year 2000).



THE TERRITORY

One of the greatest strengths of the Coppa Milano–Sanremo is its ability to renew itself every year while never losing its essential connection to the route of the historic editions.

One of the main features that has made the Coppa Milano–Sanremo famous worldwide throughout its long history is the territory it crosses, spanning Lombardy, Piedmont, and Liguria. It is a mix of coastal and mountainous landscapes that has always fascinated participants and allowed them to fully experience some of the most breathtaking locations of our beautiful peninsula—and beyond.



As tradition dictates, the event's "overture" will take place at the Monza Circuit, which will welcome the crews for the customary technical and sporting scrutineering, as well as for the first demanding special stages of the competition. From there, the crews will head to the Lombard capital for an overnight stay and for the opening gala dinner, held at an exclusive location in the heart of Milan.



An exclusive prologue to the unique succession of curves and breathtaking landscapes will then lead the competitors through the enchanting scenery of the Piedmont region, where a light lunch immersed in greenery will be served, before concluding the first day of competition in Genoa, following a passage through Rapallo.

From here, on the following day, the route will pass through the legendary Colli d'Oggia and Melogno Pass for a stop in Acqui Terme, before lunch in Loano, ahead of the conclusion of the third day of competition with arrival in Sanremo. Here, the crews will attend the awards dinner to honor the winners of the 17th Historical Revival of the Coppa Milano–Sanremo and the protagonists of its 120th anniversary.

In Sanremo, on Sunday morning, the crews will be able to enjoy the atmosphere of the City of Flowers or take part in the optional race held on the historic Ospedaletti circuit. The return journey will be free and independent for all crews.



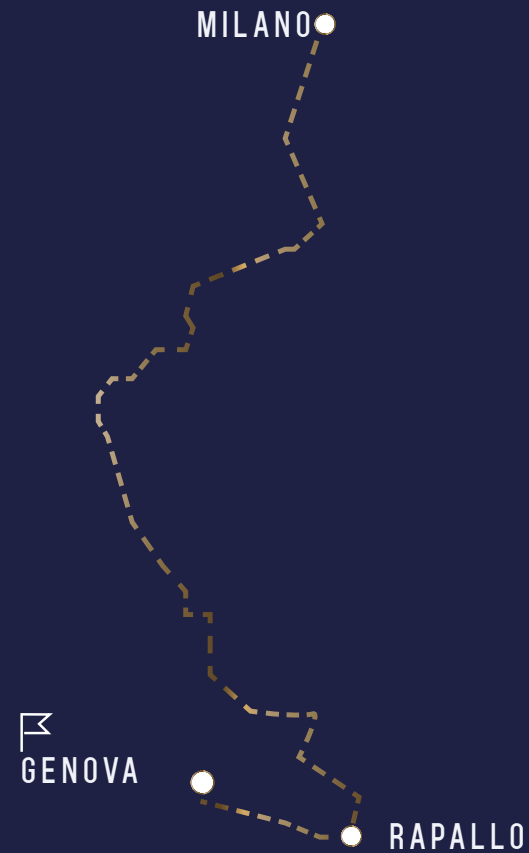

DAY 1

The first day begins with the traditional gathering at the Circuit for technical and sporting checks, followed by free laps on the track before the start of the race with the first and most challenging special stages. Afterwards, the crews will transfer to the center of the Lombard capital for the opening gala dinner.



DAY 2

After the overnight stay at the hotel and departure from the center of Milan, participants will travel through the charming landscapes of the Piedmont region for a delightful light lunch surrounded by nature.

From there, the route will continue towards Genoa, with a brief passage through Rapallo before arrival. In Genoa, the second day of competition will conclude with an informal chic dinner.



DAY 3

From Genoa, the route continues through the enchanting landscapes of the Bolzaneto hinterland, leading to a stop in Acqui Terme and a lunch break in the relaxing setting of Loano.

This serves as a prelude to the demanding and traditional special stages of Colle d'Oggia and Melogno, which will take competitors to Portosole for the end of the race, before reaching Sanremo, where the third day will conclude with the traditional parade through the streets of the historic city center and the subsequent awards ceremony during the awards dinner at the Sanremo Casino.



DAY 4

The fourth and final day will take place in the City of Flowers, offering those who wish to relax the chance to enjoy the city's unique atmosphere.

For those who prefer to take part, an optional race will be held on the historic Ospedaletti circuit, after which participants will be free to return independently.

The amounts indicated show the total sum, with VAT applied according to the new rules, to be paid in full to Equipe Grand Prix srl.
